

**Take It Down:  
Nonconsensual Dissemination of  
Intimate Images**

As legislatures across the country enact and refine laws addressing nonconsensual dissemination of intimate images—commonly referred to as "revenge porn"—judges are increasingly called upon to interpret and apply these statutes in both criminal and civil contexts. This session will provide an overview of the statutory landscape, explore constitutional challenges including First Amendment and due process concerns, and discuss evidentiary and procedural issues that may arise in these cases. Panelists will also consider the impact of these cases on victims, defendants, and the broader justice system.

**Learning Objectives:**

1. **Understand the Legal Framework:** Participants will gain a comprehensive understanding of the current statutes addressing nonconsensual dissemination of intimate images (revenge porn), including their key provisions, criminal and civil applications, and recent legal developments.
2. **Navigate Constitutional and Procedural Challenges:** Judges will develop the ability to identify and address constitutional issues such as First Amendment concerns and due process protections, as well as procedural challenges related to evidence and privacy in cases involving revenge porn.
3. **Apply Best Practices in Adjudication:** Attendees will acquire practical tools for handling revenge porn cases with sensitivity, ensuring fair treatment of all parties involved, while protecting victims' rights and maintaining the integrity of the judicial process.
