



Mrs. Sally (Salwa) Kader is a world-renowned philanthropist, humanitarian, and advocate for peace. She is the Founder and President of the *International Federation for Peace and Sustainable Development (IFPSD)* a United Nations accredited organization since 2001. Mrs. Kader has worked tirelessly to pursue her lifelong passion to promote international peace, security, and justice with the mission to promote human rights, women and girl's rights, youth leadership, interfaith dialogue, prevention of human trafficking, and protection of cultural heritage. She also serves as the CEO of the Intergovernmental Organization "ESD" and co-founder of the "SKM Foundation" to defeat MRSA, both of which are

accredited by the United Nations.

Mrs. Kader is on several boards and serves as senior advisor to a wide range of advocacy groups and committees. Her involvements include the Advisory Committee and Permanent Representative of the Convention on the Elimination of All Forms of Discrimination against Women, Convention on the Rights of the Child, United Nations Religious, non-discrimination, and human rights Committees, the Israel Palestine NGO Working Group, SNGSSC, American Anti-Discrimination Committee, and UN advisor for the Starkey Hearing Aid Foundation.

Mrs. Kader works as the Ambassador for Children in Slavery 21st Century Campaign, as well as the Ambassador and Auxiliary Board Member of the CIS, in support of the Virtual Global Task Force in collaboration with Interpol and the FBI as the first international law enforcement task force to protect children worldwide over the internet. She also worked with the US State Department for the empowerment of women in business and was the former Director of the United Nations Women's Guild.

Mrs. Kader is a Member of United Nations Secretary-General Advisory Committee on Genocide Prevention;

She is Senior Advisor and an honorary member of the Women Parliamentarian to end violence against women in the Middle East and North Africa region, a member of the (NAWJ), and the (IAWJ).

Mrs. Kader regularly hosts and organizes high-level events at the United Nations Headquarters in New York, Geneva, Vienna, and around the world. She holds numerous highly anticipated events at each annual international conference at the United Nations such as the Commission for Status of Women, symposiums on Human Trafficking, the Commission on Social Development, International Youth Day, and side events during the General Assembly each September to name a few.

The IFPSD made history time and again under the fearless and trailblazing leadership of Mrs. Kader. She notably spearheaded the first interfaith dialogue at the United Nations Headquarters in NYC which made history with the congregation of unprecedented participation of 30 Rabbis and Imams from 13 countries to discuss peace initiatives and collaboration. In 2004, IFPSD drafted and submitted the first-ever document advocating for the implementation of international legal standards condemning religious prejudice, which was signed by over sixty religious and faith-based leaders and theorists from around the world. Mrs. Kader annually hosts interfaith dialogue and faith-based events with the involvement and support of powerful figures from all backgrounds, governments, and leaders of various religions at the United Nations Headquarters to build peaceful and inclusive societies and has convened dialogues for peace among leaders from many different religions including Buddhism, Hinduism, Judaism, Islam, and Christianity.

Mrs. Kader has led and participated in programs for leadership, peace, and cross-cultural understanding among young people, including Sports for Peace Walk and the International Youth Sports Program to bring youth all over the world, empower them to overlook all differences, and foster a culture of peace, respect, and equality. Mrs. Kader has globally empowered youth through programs of education, sports initiatives, and leadership.

Mrs. Kader was an initiator when she first hosted Model United Nations Programs in the exclusive General Assembly Hall at the UNHQ as the venue for students of the Montessori schools for many years.

In the effort to combat human trafficking and accompanying atrocities, Mrs. Kader spearheaded various projects to combat human trafficking in vulnerable regions and created effective programs around the world. Mrs. Kader's periodically organizes and accompanies her IFPSD delegations to visit refugee camps such as the Al-Zaatari Camp in Jordan. Her delegation was in cooperation with the Jordanian government and the UNHCR where she first initiated a program to educate women and girls on protecting themselves from human traffickers.

In 2017 the security council passed a resolution 2347 to prosecute at the Hague for destruction and looting of antiquities in times of conflict, Mrs. Kader organized and host a ground breaking event at the United Nations, with the Holy See, Italy and France, and with the support of UN member states, world-renowned archaeologists, ministers of culture from many countries, museums around the world, academia, and media to host the groundbreaking first-ever high-level event on the "Preservation of Cultural Heritage in Times of Conflict" at the UNHQ in New York.

Mrs. Kader is regularly featured in major media publications through news networks and television across the world. Her events have seen the involvement of many distinguished government officials, world leaders, and heads of states. During the 70th Session of the United Nations General Assembly, Mrs. Kader hosted the first-ever First Lady High-Level Forum on Education where spouses of 58 world leaders represented were involved including the First Lady of Haiti, Ghana, Guyana, Gambia, The President of Malawi, Barbara Bush, and H.E. Mrs. Ban Soon-Taek, wife of former Secretary-General Ban Ki-moon amongst many others. Former U.S. President Bill Clinton was the keynote speaker at her high-level event on hearing health at the United Nations Headquarters in New York. She has collaborated on initiatives with the Queen of Sweden on the rights of the child.

Mrs. Sally Kader is a highly acclaimed international speaker. Her speaking engagements around the world include the UN Headquarters in New York and Geneva, the International Peace Conferences at the Arab League Headquarters in Cairo, the UN Pavilion at the 2010 Shanghai World Expo in China, Parliament in Sweden, and universities including Georgetown University, American University, Columbia University, Wollongong University in Dubai and Saint Mary University in Leavenworth, Kansas among others. Mrs. Kader participated as a panelist for several human trafficking conferences including those on Children in Slavery, and Human Trafficking.

Mrs. Kader was invited to participate and speak at the UNESCO World Conference on ESD in South Korea. Annually, Mrs. Kader attends as a distinguished guest of honor at the People's Republic of China and its National People's Congress. She annually addresses the high-level forum as a keynote speaker and participant of the expert dialogues at the annual Nishan conference. The high-level World Women's Forum assembles world leaders of all sectors, government ministers, and academia at the hometown of Confucius, Qufu city. Mrs. Kader has visited many regions of China to promote peace and build bridges of understanding.

President Kader is the recipient of many distinguished awards as recognized by heads of states, governments, and organizations around the world. Awards include the United Nations Millennium Development Goal Award, the spirit of the United Nations, the Voices of African Mother Award, the Sinai Peace Award, and the Peace Award from the Governor of Alexandria in Egypt, the Montessori Model United Nations Host Award, Delta Zeta Award, and the Global Ambassador for Peace Award, Lady Justice Award by NAWJ, among others.

President Kader holds a degree in history and studied mediation, comparative religion, communications, and conflict resolution at Harvard University and Columbia University. She is married to a respected United Nations diplomat and has three children.
