

June Forrest:

June K. Forrest is the Assistant Dean of Career Services at Seton Hall University Law School where she oversees and leads the Law School's job placement efforts, developing job opportunities throughout New Jersey and New York as well as nationally, in law firms, with the bench and in the corporate sector.

Prior to her position at Seton Hall Law, Dean Forrest had a long career practicing law, early in her career in private practice and for the bulk of her career in government. From 2010 to 2015 she served as Senior Counsel to New Jersey Governor Chris Christie and then as the Deputy Director of Governor Christie's Appointments Office. In that role, she advised the Governor on a range of employment matters and issues and vetted candidates for judicial, prosecutorial, cabinet and board appointments. She also acted as a liaison between the Governor's Office and cabinet officials for all employment matters.

For over 25 years Dean Forrest worked in the New Jersey Attorney General's Office (Division of Law) starting as a Deputy Attorney General and ultimately rising to the level of Assistant Attorney General. She handled and supervised a broad range of trial, appellate and administrative matters, developing an expertise in employment litigation and counseling and in New Jersey civil service law. She is one of the co-authors of the State of New Jersey's Policy Prohibiting Harassment and Discrimination and served on several State-wide taskforces and judicial committees focused on discrimination, the ADA, mediation and improving New Jersey's parks. She has a number of published New Jersey Appellate and Supreme Court opinions. She is also a sitting member of the New Jersey Supreme Court's Committee on Women in the Courts and is a member of and active in a number of bar associations. Dean Forrest was the 2020 recipient of the Seton Hall "Woman of Substance Award." She is a graduate of Rutgers Law School and Rutgers University.
