We held a Pathways to The Bench program at New England Law Boston on February 2, 2023. Panelists included **Judges Marylou Muirhead (ret.), Cat Ham, Erika Reis and Amy Blake**. The students asked interesting and engaging questions.

Judges Karen Green (ret.) and Valerie Yarashus launched a mentoring program at Harvard Law School through the school's Women's Law Student Association. The first event, held on February 27, 2023, was a great success. Next up the law

Participating judges included NAWJ District One members: Amy Lyn Blake (Appeals Court), Catherine Ham (Superior Court), Helen Brown Bryant (Juvenile Court) and Judges Shannon Frison (Superior Court), Michelle Fentress (District Court), and Catherine Byrne(District Court). District One member **Judge Diana H. Horan** has been appointed Chief Justice of the Housing Court. She was the first woman appointed to the Housing Court and is the first woman Chief Justice of the Housing Court.
