Bell (Ret.), Court of Appeals of Maryland will star as **Frederick Douglass**. Magistrate Judge Tanya Jones Bosier, Superior Court of the District of Columbia will play his wife, **Helen Pitts Douglass**. Rocelyn Halili, Esq., Attorney and Actor, will play **Susan B. Anthony.** Principal Administrative Law Judge Paul B. Handy, D.C. Office of Administrative Hearings, who is the author of the play, will be the director and narrator.

The play will be followed by a panel discussion on voting rights. Panelist Jon Greenbaum is a Senior Attorney with the Lawyer's Project, who has handled a number of high profile voting rights cases. He represented many people whose face significant barriers when exercising their voting rights. Panelist Caroline Van Zile is the Solicitor General of the District of Columbia. She litigated a case on appeal involving the fairness of the 2020 District of Columbia Election.
