Memphis Municipal Court Judge Teresa Jones died on January 2 after a battle with cancer. She was 61. Judge Jones began serving in Division One of Memphis Municipal Court on January 15, 2019, after having been appointed by Memphis Mayor Jim Strickland. She won election to that seat in October 2019.
