Ian Gershengorn is Chair of Jenner & Block's Appellate and Supreme Court Practice. He is one of the nation's premier appellate advocates, having argued before the U.S. Supreme Court 17 times, and he currently represents clients in complex litigation in both state and federal courts. Before rejoining the firm in 2017, Ian served in the Office of the Solicitor General during the Obama Administration, first as Principal Deputy Solicitor General and then as Acting Solicitor General of the United States.

Ian graduated from Harvard College and Harvard Law School. He clerked for Judge Amalya Kearse on the United States Court of Appeals for the Second Circuit, and then for Justice John Paul Stevens on the U.S. Supreme Court.

Ian is a member of the American Academy of Appellate Lawyers and of the American Law Institute. He currently teaches a seminar on The Roberts Court at Harvard Law School.
