Dr. Michele Goodwin holds the Chancellor's Professorship at the University of California, Irvine, with appointments at the School of Law, School of Public Health, Department of Gender and Sexuality Studies, and Department of Criminology, Law, and Society. She is the recipient of the 2020-2021 Distinguished Senior Faculty Award for Research, the highest honor bestowed by the University of California. She is also the first law professor at the UC Irvine to receive this award. She is also the founding director of the Center for Biotechnology and Global Health Policy at UC Irvine and is an elected member of the American Law Institute and also serves as a Fellow of the American Bar Foundation and the Hastings Center.

Dr. Goodwin's scholarship is hailed as "exceptional" in the New England Journal of Medicine. One of her recent law review articles entitled, "The Thirteenth Amendment: Modern Slavery, Capitalism, and Mass Incarceration," was published in the *Cornell Law Review* in May 2019. A prolific author, her scholarship is also published or forthcoming in *The Yale Law Journal*, *Harvard Law Review*, *Cornell Law Review*, *NYU Law Review*, *California Law Review*, and *Northwestern Law Review*, among others. Dr. Goodwin's publications include five books and over 80 articles, essays and book chapters as well as numerous commentaries. She has been featured in *Politico, Salon.com, Forbes, The Washington Post, The New York Times, Los Angeles Times, The Boston Globe, Chicago Sun-Times, NPR, HBO's Vice News*, and Ms. Magazine, among others.

She serves on the executive committee and national board of the American Civil Liberties Union and is a highly sought after voice on civil liberties, civil rights, reproductive rights and justice, and cultural politics. She is also the host of "On the Issues with Michele Goodwin" at Ms. Magazine. Prior to teaching law, she was a Gilder-Lehrman Post-Doctoral Fellow at Yale University.
