Attacks on Judges are up across the board

- 400% for federal judges
- Similar numbers for state judges



The types of threats have changed

- Female judges face a 40% higher threat risk
- Threats are more insidious and more violent

Any search engine returns your address and more




There are few laws protecting your privacy

Even where they exist, enforcement is difficult


It's Out There
