



Elaine Metlin is a retired litigation partner who spent most of her 33-year legal career at Dickstein Shapiro LLP, where she focused on complex antitrust lawsuits, white collar criminal defense and general commercial litigation. She chaired Dickstein Shapiro's Women's Leadership Initiative for more than a decade. She also served on Dickstein Shapiro's Executive Committee, chaired its Hiring Committee, cochaired its Professional Development Committee and served on its Compensation Advisory Committee.

Currently, Ms. Metlin serves on the Resource Board of the National Association of Women Judges, which she co-chaired for many years. She serves on the Board of Women Lawyers on Guard Action Network and is a Fellow of the American Bar
