Adult Drug Court Participant Eligibility Criteria

- Must be a resident of Prince George's County
- Must be at least 18 years of age
- > History of substance use verified by assessment team
- History of mental health diagnoses will be reviewed on a case by case basis
- > Offenders convicted of crimes of violence as defined in MD Code, Public Safety, § 5-101(c) are not be eligible except for number (3)assault in the first or second degree, and (4) burglary in the first, second, or third degree which will be reviewed on a case by case basis.
- Recent domestic violence and child abuse must be reviewed on a case by case
- No outstanding warrants
- Violations of Probation cases must be approved by the assigned Judge

Adult Drug Court Program Overview

Adult Drug Court is a Four Phase Program Model

- Program capacity:120
- Random Drug Testing at least 2x per week
- Adhere to nightly curfew based on Phase
- Attend court hearings at least every 30 days
- Enter and complete an outpatient substance use program
- > Meet with case manager each month as directed
- Enroll in General Education Degree program or provide proof of high school diploma or G.E.D.
- Provide proof of attendance for weekly support group meetings
- Seek employment or enroll in educational program/job training program and provide monthly verification
- Complete phase journals

Adult Drug Court Graduation Requirements

- > Successfully progressed through all phases
- > Provide proof of high school diploma or G.E.D
- > Provide proof of continued employment for at least 90 days prior to graduation
- > Completed graduation questionnaire and attend exit interview with entire team
- > Have an updated background check completed with no new offense history or outstanding warrants
- ➤ File check completed by Program Coordinator and the Assistance State's Attorney

Veterans Court Participant Eligibility Requirements

- Must be a resident of Prince George's County
- Must be at least 18 years of age
- History of substance use, mental health diagnoses or cooccurring verified by assessment team
- Offenders convicted of crimes of violence as defined in MD Code, Public Safety, § 5-101(c) are not be eligible except for number (3) assault in the first or second degree, and (4) burglary in the first, second, or third degree which will be reviewed on a case by case basis.
- Recent domestic violence and child abuse must be reviewed on a case by case
- No outstanding warrants
- Violations of Probation cases must be approved by the assigned Judge

Veterans Court Program Overview

- Capacity = 50 clients
- 4 phases
- Frequent and random drug testing
- Bi-Weekly review hearings for Phase 1 and 2. Monthly review hearings for Phase 3 and 4.
- Group & Individual Counseling as required by Treatment Provider
- Participants must attend mandated courses as required (i.e. Anger Management, Individual Counseling, Family Counseling, Post-Traumatic Stress Therapy) by Veterans Team

Veterans Court Phase Outlines

Veterans Court is a Four Phase Program Model

Phase 1: 30 days, Phase 2: 60 days, Phase 3: 90 days, Phase 4: 180 days

Case Manager to Client Ratio 1:25 / Program Capacity 50


Length of Program: Minimum of 12 months & Up to 5 years

- Random Drug Testing at least 2x per week
- Attend court hearings at least every 30 days
- Enter and complete a substance abuse or mental health program
- Meet with case manager each month as directed
- Provide proof of attendance for weekly support group meetings
- Seek employment or enroll in educational program/job training program and provide monthly verification
- Complete phase journals


Veterans Court Graduation Requirements

- Successfully progressed through all phases
- Provide proof of continued employment for at least 90 days prior to graduation
- Completed graduation questionnaire and attend exit interview with entire team
- Have an updated background check completed with no new offense history or outstanding warrants
- File check completed by Program Coordinator and the Assistance State's Attorney
